COVID-19 EMERGENCY

- On March 16, 2020, the General Manager declared a District State of Emergency
- DSRSD provides essential services 24/7
- Constantly evolving public health orders and Cal/OSHA requirements
- District safety practices were successful



DSRSD COVID-19 RESPONSE

- COVID-19 Taskforce
- Safety plans and protocols
- Staggered work schedules and telecommuting
- Personal Protective Equipment
- HVAC improvements in all buildings
- Safe Return to Onsite Work Plan
- Symptom self-check and contact tracing applications
- Administration of supplemental leave programs

Don't touch your face

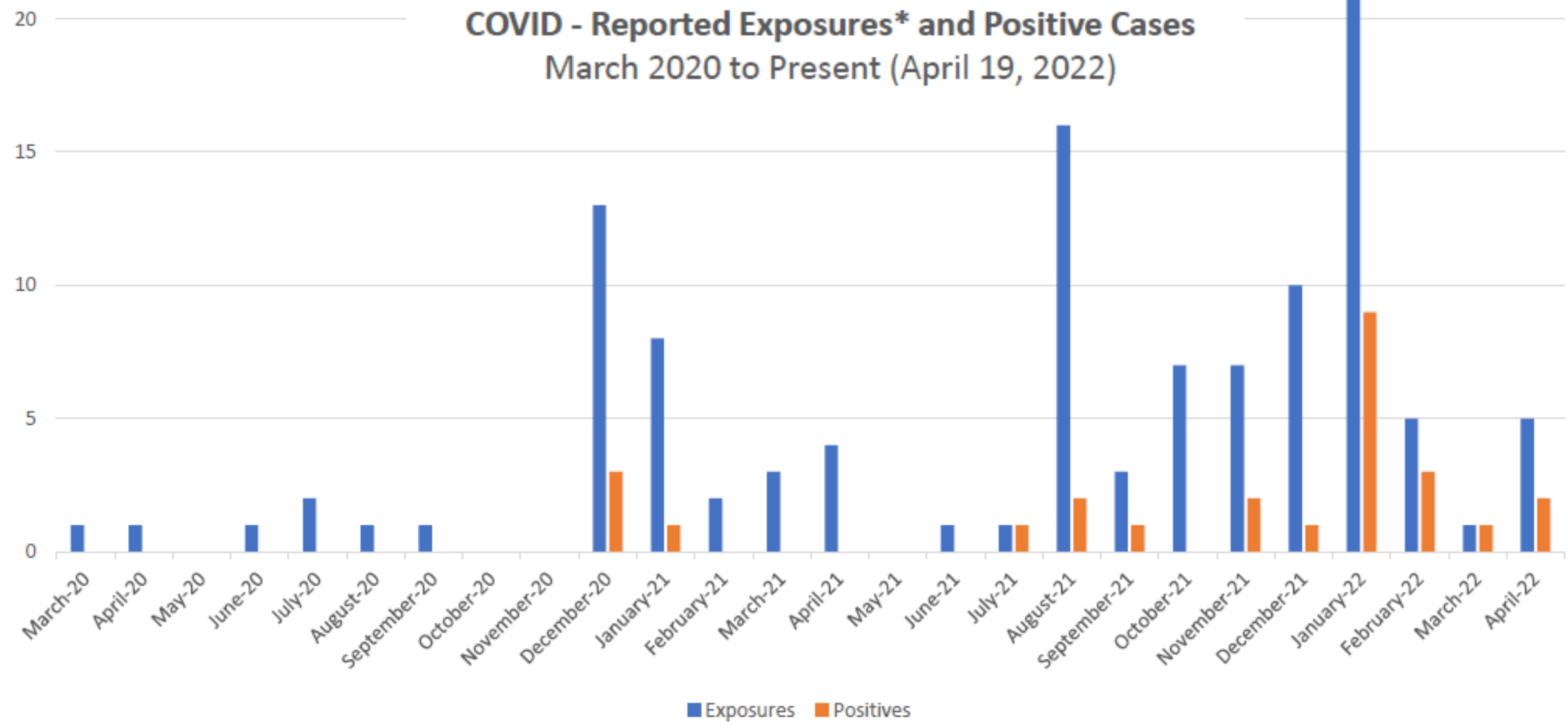
SICK OR SYMPTOMATIC?
Cough, fever, chills, difficulty breathing
STAY HOME!

WASH HANDS OFTEN
for 20 seconds, or use hand sanitizer after touching shared surfaces

Maintain social distancing, whether standing or seated. Do not touch other people

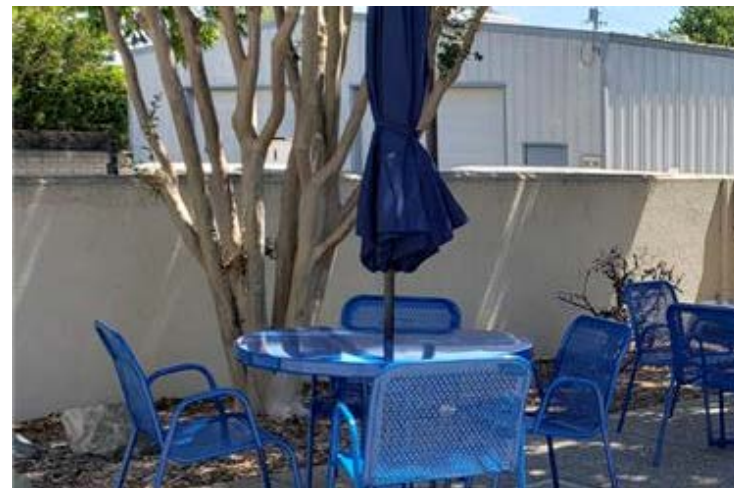
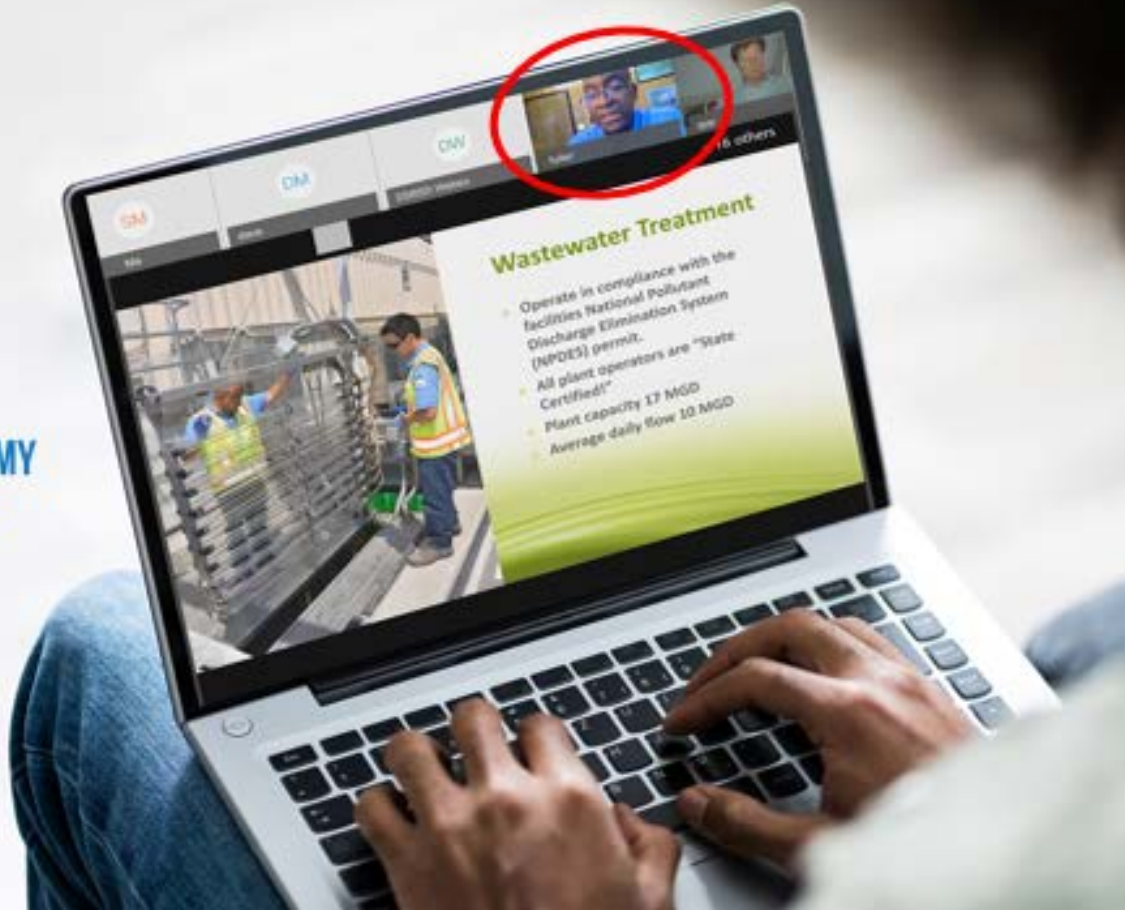
CLEAN/DISINFECT
