A separate form of government providing focused services.

In California:

- 3,400 special districts
- 482 cities
- 58 counties
- 939 school districts

 (a separate governmental type)




DSRSD was created in 1953 as the Parks Community Service District

The District has evolved over the years

» In 1960, the District became Valley Community Services District (VCSD).



» In 1977, the District changed its name again to Dublin San Ramon Services District (DSRSD).





When the cities of Dublin and San Ramon incorporated in the early 1980's, they assumed the following services from DSRSD:





DSRSD remains in charge of water in all its forms

Governance



Citizens of Dublin and portions of San Ramon elect a five-member Board of Directors



Rovember of even numbered years (the same as Congressional elections)



The Board appoints a chief executive officer, the General Manager, who works for the Board and appoints all other staff




